Draubzdex, —A Drawback of 'Twenty Cents is allowed on every hundred weight of Biscutt manufactured in this Colony from flour, the duty on which shall have been chargeable and paid. Provided that no Drawback shall be payable on any quantity of Biscutt, the Drawback in respect whereof would not amount to Twelve Dollars, nor on any biscutt manufactured from flour, the duty on which has been secured by bond, and not actually paid.

A Drawback is allowed in lieu of any Duties that may have been paid on materials for shipbuilding, computed at the rate of Ouc Dollar per ton, on every ship or vessel newly built from the keel in the colony.
