Langton, undergo every year a very careful scrutiny. There is no difficulty in making out a balance sheet a few days after the year closes (June 30th), but for the proper checking of the accounts. against cush, against authorized Parliamentary appropriations, &c., there are three books, kept by different people, and these must all be brought into harmony before a definite statement can be made. Transfers of small sums from one "service" to another may in this way somewhat alter a few of the figures
