## ONTARIO AND QUEBEC.

#### GOLD.

The Chaudière gold fields still remain idle, pending explorations and preparatory work on the part of the English Company, the 'Suth Aurora Mining Company," which has acquired the control of them. This company has set apart a sum of £12.00 sig. for exploration, which, if successful, will at once be followed by operations on a larger scale, for which machinery is already being imperied.

#### SILVER.

We have no returns from Silver Islet. The mine, however, increases in productiveness, the quantity raised in August and September, 1-74, being greater than in any two previous months.

#### COPPER.

The Bruce and Associated mines (West Cauada Mining Company) raised in 1873, 940 1000s of ore, worth in England £13 395 st. The Harvey Hill Mine has produced rothing during the past year, the time having been spentin working unproductive ar und The Huntington Copper and Sulphur Company have done the following work 1 tuen mines at Dinonton, P. Q. :

The e are 50 kins for burning out the sulphur, five furnaces for ca cining, and the necessary machinery and mant complete for putting mouthly about 50 tons of one through the process. At the beginning of next year there will be mans of treating nearly double that quantity of ore, additional furnaces being new in course of construction, and extension of plant being made. About 100 hands receive constant employment.

The Black Bay or Enterprise Mine, near Black Boy on Lake Superior, was partially developed by a Boston company in 1873, who to k out at our 30 tors of ore, valued at Swansea at rom £ 0 to £13 sig per ton. A shatt nat been put down fifty 1 et, the vein increa ing in size, and having a s rong show of silver and silver bearing quartz, similar to that of Silver Islet. A tramway has been built from the mine to the shore of Black Bay, if miles, and a good dock costrocted at the terminus. About 40 to sof ricked ore have been taken out, and twe ty barrels sent to the smelling worse at Wyandotte. It is intended to erect smelting works near the mine.

#### IRON.

Mines' have supplied The Marmora about 25,000 tons of ore during the past

The Ottawa Iron and Steel Manufacturing Company is formed for the purpose of working the "Haycock Iron Location," stuated about eight miles from Ottawa in the townships of Hull and Templeton. The ore is practically unlimited in quantity ore is practically unlimited in quantity, the amount to be won at a depth of 200 feet, being estimated at 6,300,100 tons, and has the remarkable quality f making steel at the first run from which tools have been made, taking a good cutting edge A tramway of six and a quarter miles connects the mine w th the furnace site. All the necessary bulldings, dwillings, &c., are already erected. Though the ore might be ships ed at remunerative prices to the United States, it is intended to smelt it on the ground, and also to establish works in connection with the mine for the manufacture. fac'u'e of the "arious products of iron and steel. From the many favorable facts distinguishing the enterprise, the company may reasonably expect very large profits.

No returns have been received of last year's work at the Badwin Mines. It is intended to erect furnaces for smelting with anthracite, which will produce pig icon at a cost of twenty dollars per ton.
