Kailways of the Dominion.

On the 30th June, 1877, the close of the fiscal year, there were in operation in the Dominion 5,346 miles of railway, besides 228 miles of United States roads worked by Canadian Companies, in all 5,574 miles. This shows an increase in the mileage of railways of 417 miles in the year. 80 miles are double track, viz: 79 on the Great Western, and 1 on the Canada Southern. The gauges are—
