The increase in the revenue from Lighthouse and Coast Service of \$104,119 was an uncommon one, being almost entirely made up of the sum of \$101,151 paid by the Imperial Government in connection with the lighthouse at Cape Race, Newfoundland, for details of which transaction see post, chapter on Marine and Fisheries.
