619. The educational system of the North-West Territories is under Board of the control of a Board of Education, appointed by the Lieutenant Education, N. Governor in Council, and composed of eight members, five Protestant W. T. and three Roman Catholic, of which the Bishop of Saskatchewan and Calgary is at present the chairman.

620. No school district shall comprise an area of more than 25 School square miles, nor shall it contain less than four resident heads of families, or a smaller school population that 10, *i.e.*, children between the ages of 5 and 20.

621. No religious instruction is allowed in any public school before Religious 3 o'clock in the afternoon, at which time such instruction as is permitted by the trustees may be given, parents having the privilege of withdrawing their children at that hour, if desired.

625. Union or high schools have been opened at Regina, Moosomin, High Moose Jaw, Lacombe (B.C.), Prince Albert and Calgary. At the schools, examinations in June, 1891, 115 pupils attended.
