- 1888. February 15. Signing of the Fishery Treaty at Washington. August. Rejection of the Fishery Treaty by the United States Senate.
 1889. September 19. Landslide (second) from Citadel Rock, Quebec. 45 persons killed.
- 1890. May 6. Longue Pointe Lunatic Asylum, near Montreal, destroyed by fire; over 70 lives lost. The buildings had been erected at a cost of \$1,132,232. October 6. McKinley Tariff Bill came into operation in the United States.
- 1891. April 6. Population of the Dominion, 4,833,239. April 29. The first of the new C.P.R. steamers
 - The first of the new C.P.R. steamers arrived at Vancouver from Yokohama, beating the record by over two days. The mails were landed in Montreal in 3 days 17 hours, from Vancouver.
 - June 6. The Right Hon. Sir John A. Macdonald, G.C.B., Premier of the Dominion, died.
- 1892. April 17. Death of the Hon. Alexander Mackenzie. May 24. Death of Sir Alexander Campbell, Lieutenant-Governor of Ontario. December 5. Resignation (from ill-health) of Sir J. J. C. Abbott, K.C.M.G., Premier of the Dominion.
- 1893. April 4. The Court of Arbitration, respecting the seal fisheries in Behring Sea, which met formally on 23rd March, began its session. Arbitrators: Baron de Courcel (Belgium), Lord Hannen (Great Britain), and Sir John Thompson (Canada).
