There was an increase in value of exports to eleven countries, the largest increase being in exports to the United States, the value of which showed an increase of nearly five million dollars, the other principal increases being to British West Indies, Newfoundland, South America, Belgium, and the Hawaii Islands. The principal decreases were in exports to the United Kingdom, Australasia and Holland and the West Indies other than British.
