1567. The government expenditure for the year on public schools was \$147,670; the county fund amounted to \$94,430, and the district assessment to \$181,177, making a total of \$446,188. The average cost per pupil, including the pupils of superior and grammar schools, was \$6.06. The total amount expended by the government in 1893, including grants, salaries and expenses, was \$170,581, being $32\cdot 2$ per cent of the total expenditure on account of public education.

An Arbor Day, on the same principle as that in Ontario, was held on 13th May, 1893, when 3,381 trees and 696 shrubs were planted, and 487 flower beds laid out.
