NEW BRUNSWICK.

The provincial Board of Education of New Brunswick consists of the Lieutenant-Governor, the members of the Executive Council, the President of the University of New Brunswick, and the Chief Superintendent of Education.

The Government expenditure for the year on public schools was *\$159., 224; the county fund amounted to \$91,528, and the district assessment to \$211,115, making a total of \$461,867.

An Arbor Day, on the same principle as that in Ontario, was held on 18th May, 1896, when 2,192 trees and 1,703 shrubs were planted, and 739 flower beds laid out.
