In addition to the foregoing number of light-houses, &c., there were 15 fog-bells, 10 fog-guns or bombs, 31 whistling-buoys, 32 bell-buoys and 41 gas-buoys.

These light-houses and light-stations, &c., were manned by 719 light-keepers, engineers of fog-whistles and masters of light-ships, while the whole number of persons employed on the outside service was 1,916. The lights, beacons, &c., were distributed in 1902 among the several divisions as follows:—
