Of 4,973,000 registered letters estimated to have been sent in 1902 only 154 containing money failed to reach their destination. The contents, or a portion thereof, of 72 were made good by the officials or others held responsible for the loss; 6 were stolen, 4 lost or misdelivered, and in 22 cases no evidence could be obtained to account for discrepancies; 42 accidentally destroyed during course of post; 7 still under investigation, and 1 stated to have not reached office for which intended. There was an increase in the total number sent, as compared with 1901, of 445,000, and a decrease in the number that miscarried of 30. In every 32,292 letters registered one miscarried, a smaller proportion than in 1901, when it was one in 24,609 letters.
