These returns show (1) that the passengers killed on Canadian railways in 1903 were 2·39 per million carried; United States, 0·53 per million; United Kingdom, 0·07—(2) that the passengers injured on Canadian railways in 1903 were 11·06 per million carried. United States, 10·20 per million; United Kingdom, 1·43 per million. The Canadian returns show that the proportion of passengers killed has increased from 1·29 per million carried to 2·39 per million or nearly 90 per cent, and the proportion of passengers injured from 7·83 per million to 11·06 or more than 41 per cent.
