In addition to the foregoing number of lighthouses, &c., there were 16 fog-bells, 10 fog-guns or bombs, 31 whistling-buoys, 36 bell-buoys and 41 gas-buoys.

These light houses and light stations, &c., were manned by 751 light-keepers, engineers of fog-whistles and masters of light ships, while the whole number of persons employed on the outside service was 2,027. The lights, beacons, &c., were distributed in 1903 among the several divisions as follows:—
