The New Brunswick game laws have been materially modified since they were printed in this Year Book. No cow moose is to be hunted under two years of age. No cow caribou is to be hunted or shot at all, the penalty for breach being from \$100 to \$200 or from 20 days to two months. No moose, caribou, or deer is to be shot at night under a penalty of \$50 to \$150 or imprisonment from one to three months. An increase is made in the license fee for nonresidents hunting moose or caribou from \$30 to \$50.
