There were three Art schools in operation in 1903. In connection with and under the control of the Department of Education were 288 public libraries, with 536,325 books, and about 36,480 members. Their property was valued at \$424,500, with liabilities of \$16,339. Besides these there were 140 free libraries, with upwards of 628,248 volumes and 137,460 readers, with assets amounting to \$845,104 and liabilities \$105,650.

The second Friday in May in each year has been set apart under the name of Arbor Day, for the purpose of planting trees and improving the school grounds. In 1903, 8,195 trees were planted and 14,960 plants set out.
