

400,000 the annual sum payable is \$375,000; thereafter until the population has reached 800,000 it is \$562,500; thereafter until the population has reached 1,200,000 it is \$750,000; and thereafter the annual sum payable is \$1,125,000. A further additional annual allowance of \$93,750, in lieu of public lands, is payable by Canada to each of the provinces for five years to provide for the construction of necessary public buildings.

Alberta and Saskatchewan are divided by the meridian of 110° west from Greenwich. They lie between British Columbia on the west and Manitoba and the Northwest territories on the east, and between the international boundary at the 49th parallel on the south and the 60th parallel on the north. Alberta is 185 miles wide at 49°, 403 miles at 54° 30', and 347 miles at 60°, with a land area of 251,180 square miles, and a water area of 2,360 square miles. Saskatchewan is 393 miles wide at 49°, 330 miles wide at 54° 30', and 277 miles at 60°, with a land area of 242,332 square miles and a water area of 8,318 square miles. The area of the two provinces is 504,190 square miles, which is as large as the united areas of Great Britain, France and Germany, as large as the states of Michigan, Wisconsin, Iowa, Minnesota and the two Dakotas, and more than twice as large as the six New England states, together with New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Ohio and Indiana. Some of the world's prize wheat has been grown at Fort Vermilion on Peace river, north of the 58th parallel; and on the Liard river three degrees farther north, where the climate is said to be warmer than on any part of Peace river, wheat always succeeds. From north to south each province extends 766 miles, or as long as from the mouth of the Detroit river to the mouth of the Saguenay in a straight line.

The control of wireless telegraphy in the Dominion is secured by chapter 49, which provides that no person shall establish a wireless telegraph station or install or work any apparatus in any place or on board any registered ship, except under and in accordance with a license granted by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries with the consent of the Governor in Council. Whoever establishes a wireless telegraph station without a license is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$50, and on conviction upon indictment to a fine not exceeding \$500 and to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months, and in either case shall be liable to forfeit any apparatus
