Note. The average production of wheat per acre in Manitoba for the thirteen years 1890–1902, according to the local government returns, was 19°22 bushels per acre, of barley 30°77 bushels, and of oats 35°65 bushels. In the territories according to similar returns for the five years 1898–1902 the average of wheat was 19°53 bushels, of barley 25°6 bushels, and of oats 35°30 bushels. The low average yield in the Census year 1901 was due to the relative dryness of the growing season—the rainfall being but little more than one-half an average.
