Mar. 19. J. George Garneau, Mayor of Quebec, the Hon. George A. Drummond, K.C.M.G., of Montreal, Byron E. Walker, of Toronto, Col. George T. Denison of Toronto and the Hon. Adélaré Turgeon, C.M.G., of Quebec, to be members of the National Battlefields Commission; J. George Garneau to be chairman of the commission.

Mar. 24. The Hon. James Pitt Mabee, a judge of the high court of justice, Ontario, to be chief commissioner of the Board of Railway Commissioners for Canada in the room and stead of Albert Clements Killam, deceased.

May 12. John Semmens of Stonewall, Manitoba, Inspector of Indian Agencies and Reserves, to be a commissioner to take adhesions to treaty No. 10 of such Indians as were not met with by the commissioners who negotiated that treaty in previous years; also to take adhesions to treaty 5, and to investigate and report upon claims for half-breed scrip.

June 29. William Lyon Mackenzie King, C.M.G., of Ottawa, Deputy Minister of Labour, to be a commissioner to investigate and report upon certain disputes between employers and employees in connection with cotton factories in the province of Quebec, and into the nature and causes thereof, and the relations between employers and employees in the same or kindred industries in industrial centres other than those immediately affected.

Sept. 4. Professor Adam Shortt, M.A., F.R.S.C., of Kingston, Ontario, and Michel G. La Rochelle, B.A., K.C., of Montreal to be the members of the Civil Service Commission.

Sept. 17. James Pitt Mabee of Toronto, the Hon. Michel Esdras Bernier, James Mills of Guelph, D'Arcy Scott of Ottawa, Thomas Greenway of Winnipeg, and Professor J. S. McLean of Toronto to be members of the Board of Railway Commissioners for Canada; James Pitt Mabee to be chief commissioner and D'Arcy Scott to be assistant chief commissioner thereof.

Nov. 30. Charles Evan Mackay of Waganui, New Zealand, to be commissioner to administer oaths and to take and receive affidavits, etc., in the Dominion of New Zealand to be used in the supreme court and in the exchequer court of Canada.

Nov. 28. The Rt. Hon. Sir Cecil Clementi Smith, G.C.M.G., Sir Alexander Hosie, William Lyon Mackenzie King, C.M.G., James Bennett Brunyate, I.C.S., and Robert Laidlaw, M.P., to be His Majesty's commissioners on the joint commission which is to meet at Shanghai on February 1 1909, to investigate the opium trade and the opium habit in the far east.
