values of articles to be added to manufactures in those several tables, if so classified. If added to the exports of manufactures as given in table xcvi, p. 184, or in table cvi, p. 247, the total values would be \$99,248,026 for 1904, \$101,310,252 for 1905, \$121,287,839 for 1906 and \$127,496,446 for 1908. Added to the exports of manufactures to Britain in table xcvi, the total value for 1908 would be \$52,390,637, to the United States \$54,572,028 and to other countries \$20,533,731; and the total increase in the period from 1904 to 1908 would be 28 per cent. But of course the chief component value of these exports is that of raw material.
