Banking.—The conditions of general prosperity revealed by the records of trade and revenue are reflected in the banking statistics (Tables 22-36). The total assets of the chartered banks at December 31, 1912, were \$1,526,081,158, as compared with \$1,390,069,518 in 1911. The total liabilities were \$1,292,451,137 as compared with \$1,174,323,431. Deposits by the Canadian public were \$1,012,418,559 at December 31, 1912 (Table 23), as compared with \$926,089,625 in 1911. On March 31, 1912, the total at the credit of depositors in the Post Office and Dominion Government Savings Banks was \$58,219,328, as compared with \$58,094,331 in 1911.
