CRIMINAL STATISTICS.

During the year 1911 17 persons were sentenced to death for murder, as compared with 21 in 1910. Death sentences in 1911 were carried out in seven cases compared with 19 in 1910, and were commuted to life imprisonment in eight cases in 1911 compared with two in 1910. Five persons were sentenced to life imprisonment for manslaughter in 1911 as compared with one person in 1910.
