The population of Canada in 1911 was 7,206,643, as compared with 3,689,257 in 1871, including the provinces of Prince Edward Island and British Columbia, which did not join the Union until after the first Dominion census of 1871.

Table 3 shows the increase in the population from decade to decade in (A) absolute numbers and (B) in percentages.

It will be noticed that the greatest increase took place between 1901 and 1911, the ratio being over 34 p.c., as against a percentage of under 12 for each of the two previous decades and over, 17 p.c. as between 1871 and 1881. For the whole period of forty years, the rate of increase was 95.34 p.c. The high rate of increase has been chiefly due to the settlement of the three Prairie Provinces, and, especially since the beginning of the century, of the two new provinces of Saskatchewan and Alberta.
