The provinces of Saskatchewan and Alberta were formed in 1905, and from 1906 onward all the nine provinces are included. In Saskatchewan, the sex of the teachers in secondary schools is not given; in Manitoba, the sex of the pupils is not given for any of the years, while the sex of the kindergarten pupils in Ontario was not given until 1917. Consequently, certain partial totals are printed in italies. A general summary of elementary and secondary schools under public control for 1923, or latest year reported for all, is given in Table 1 of this section.
