9.—Citizenship of the Foreign-Born.¹

At the last three decennial censuses of 1901, 1911 and 1921 inquiry has been made into the citizenship of the foreign-born population. The relevant instructions to enumerators at the 1921 census were as follows:—

The fact that foreign-born persons who have been in Canada less than five years (the length of residence required to obtain naturalization) are reported as

[&]quot;It is proper to use 'Canadian' as descriptive of every person whose home is in the country and who has acquired rights of citizenship in it. A person who was born in the United States, or France, or Germany or other foreign country, but whose home is in Canada and who is a naturalized citizen should be entered as 'Canadian'; so also should a person born in the United Kingdom or any of its colonies whose residence in Canada is not merely temporary. An alien person will be classed by nationality or citizenship according to the country of birth, or the country to which he or she professes to owe allegiance.

[&]quot;A married woman is to be reported as of the same citizenship as her husband.

[&]quot;A foreign-born child under 21 years of age is to be reported as of the same citizenship as the parents."
