## PART III.—COMMERCIAL FAILURES.

Commercial Failures in Canada, 1928.—According to Bradstreet's of January, 1929, the total number of Canadian failures reported during the calendar year 1928 was 1,863, with liabilities of 36,451,242, as against 1,993, with liabilities of 525,846,247, in 1927. In number there was a decrease in 1928 of  $6\frac{1}{2}$  p.c. as compared with 1927, while the liabilities increased by  $14 \cdot 1$  p.c. Dun's Review of January, 1929, gives the total number of insolvencies in Canada and Newfoundland in 1928 as 2,120, as compared with 2,182 in 1927, whilst liabilities reached, in 1928, the total of 533,420,199, as compared with 334,461,595 in 1927.
