Government Revenue.—The taxation of motor vehicles, garages, chauffeurs, etc., is becoming a lucrative source of Provincial Government income. In every province the operation of automobiles and motor cycles is dependent on carrying a licence duly issued by the various authorities, while similar licences permit the maintenance of garages and the driving of cars or trucks by hired chauffeurs. Perhaps the most recent form of levy on the use of motor vehicles is the gasolene tax, which has been assessed in all provinces since 1927. The accompanying table (36) shows the provincial revenue for the years 1929 and 1930, indicating, at the same time, the more important sources from which it is derived.
