The interprovincial and export movement of live stock in 1930 shows a fallingoff in cattle and calves, but an increase in swine and sheep. Total shipments in
1930 with comparative figures for 1929 in parentheses were as follows: cattle 258,365
(443,807); calves 105,966 (184,987); swine 696,258 (676,405) and sheep 144,018
(128,839). Alberta was the largest shipper in the aggregate and also the largest
shipper of hogs and sheep and lambs, reporting 62,086 cattle, 2,678 calves, 257,563
swine and 84,137 sheep. Saskatchewan led in cattle shipments and Ontario in
shipments of calves.

The marketings of live stock through stock-yards by direct shipment to packers, or by export according to provinces of origin for the calendar year 1930 are given in Table 13. In Table 14 are given the statistics of the grading of animals from five provinces marketed through the stock-yards in 1930.
