Consumption of Animal Products.—The consumption of meats in Canada in 1933 is estimated at 599,145,695 pounds of beef, 796,541,284 pounds of pork and 67,532,961 pounds of mutton and lamb. The per capita consumption of beef on this basis amounts to 56.09 pounds; pork, 74.58 pounds and mutton and lamb, 6.32 pounds, a total of 136.99 pounds of meats per capita per annum. The corresponding data for other animal products are as follows: butter, 320,821,718 pounds and 30.04 pounds; cheese, 35,255,660 pounds and 3.30 pounds; eggs, 229,146,612 dozen and 21.45 dozen, and poultry 114,144,900 pounds and 10.68 pounds.
