Total Value of Dairy Production.—The value of all dairy products in 1934 is estimated at \$181,966,021 as compared with \$170,828,667 in 1933, an increase of  $6 \cdot 5$  p.c. The value of the dairy production of Canada in 1934 was the highest since 1931 and shows an advance of \$22,891,888 or  $14 \cdot 4$  p.c. over the low value recorded in 1932. All products increased in value except factory cheese. The prices of creamery butter during the first quarter of 1934 were higher than in the same period of the preceding year. The midsummer decline was about the same as usual, but as the season advanced butter prices closely paralleled those of the previous year. The value per lb. of creamery butter, as shown in Table 3, represents an average of 19.9 cents in 1934 and 19.8 cents in 1933. Total butter shows a value of \$63,933,300 in 1934, an increase of \$3,764,191 as compared with 1933, while total cheese was valued at \$9,932,921 in 1934, a decrease of \$1,289,084.
