on the results of the annual surveys. Wholesale trade in Canada during 1935 totalled \$1,080,742,000 compared with \$1,370,066,000 in 1930. While sales were still $21 \cdot 1$ p.c. below the 1930 level, the improvement which commenced during 1933 was continued, an increase of $5 \cdot 6$ p.c. over the amount of trade recorded for 1934 bringing the index for 1935 within 4 p.c. of that for 1931. The largest increases in sales in 1934 were reported by firms dealing in industrial equipment and supplies which had suffered the most severe losses in trade between 1930 and 1933. To what extent movements in the value of wholesale sales are due to changes in prices or to variations in the physical volume of goods handled cannot be determined accurately.
