Further details of the funded debt, showing the various issues of bonds, the annual interest charges and the place at which principal and interest are payable, are given as at Mar. 31, 1937, in Table 19. From this it appears that the total payable in London at that date was \$409,867,597, in New York \$449,000,000, and in Canada \$2,478,491,235. Thus three-quarters of the funded debt of the Dominion was payable within the Dominion itself, and the interest payable outside of Canada was a comparatively small item.
