Subsection 3.—Telephone Calls

Systems operating almost 90 p.c. of all telephones in Canada made estimates by actual count on days of normal business, and, after adjusting for incompleted calls, holidays, Sundays, etc., the average was multiplied by 365. The long-distance calls in practically all cases were the actual long-distance calls put through or completed. The averages were 1,963 local and 22.6 long-distance calls per telephone and 245 telephone conversations per capita. The estimated per capita average for the United States in 1938 was 223.
