of Canada's barter terms in 1940 than in 1939. Expressed differently it may be said that, assuming it took 100 units of exports to pay for 100 units of imports in 1939, the same 100 units of exports would have commanded 105 units of imports in 1940.

Nore.—In previous editions of the Year Book, the indexes of value and volume of imports and exports were calculated on a 1936 base. These have now been re-calculated on a five-year base (1935-39=100) back to 1935, making them uniform with other indexes of the Bureau. Figures for the years 1935-37, inclusive, will be found at p. 118, Vol. I of "Trade of Canada, 1940".
