## Subsection 2.—The Fish-Processing Industry

A special article on Developments in Fish Processing, prepared by the Deputy Minister of Fisheries, Ottawa, appears in the 1941 Year Book, pp. 225-226.

Establishments, Capital, Employees, Materials Used and Products.—Among the fish-processing establishments in operation in Canada in 1942, the salmon canneries comprised the principal group with an investment valued at \$16,602,929, or 49 p.c. of the total for all establishments. About 74 p.c. of the value of production of the establishments was credited to fish canned, cured or otherwise prepared, and 26 p.c. to fish marketed for consumption in a fresh state.
