Size of Establishments as Measured by Number of Employees.—In 1923, establishments employing 501 hands or over accounted for $21\cdot4$ p.c. of the total number of employees engaged in manufacturing. By 1929 the proportion had increased to $27\cdot3$ p.c. of the total, thereby showing the increasing concentration of production into larger units. This tendency, however, was checked by the depression, the percentage having dropped in 1933 to $20\cdot5$ p.c. (central electric stations included). With the recovery in production since 1933 the percentage has risen again and in 1941 stood at $38\cdot3$ p.c. The same also holds true for all establishments employing 101 hands or over. In 1923 they employed $58\cdot6$ p.c. of the total, in 1929, $61\cdot9$ p.c., in 1933, $55\cdot7$ p.c., and in 1941, $70\cdot0$ p.c.
