It will be observed that the age group 16 to under 21 years shows a much higher crime rate than the juvenile group (7 to under 16 years) or the total young persons group (7 to under 21 years). After increasing steadily in recent years, the rate for this group dropped from 950 per 100,000 population in 1939 to 773 in 1942.

Major Offences.—From Table 21 it will be observed that theft and receiving stolen goods; breaking, entering and theft; and other wilful damage to property account for the great bulk of the offences. In 1942, $94 \cdot 1$ p.c. of the major offences were in these classes.

War-Time Trends.—Major offences for juveniles, which had increased only $1\cdot 0$ p.c. during the three latest pre-war years increased by $37\cdot 9$ p.c. during the first three war years, 1939-42. The increase was chiefly in convictions for theft, burglary and common assault. Convictions for theft, which had decreased $9\cdot 1$ p.c. from 1936 to 1939, have shown an increase of $30\cdot 6$ p.c. from 1939 to 1942. Thefts of bicycles and automobiles have also shown a much faster rate of increase in the same comparison. The rate of increase for burglary, which had been $17\cdot 0$ p.c. in the period 1936-39, advanced to $25\cdot 9$ p.c. during 1939-42. Convictions for common assault, which had declined $35\cdot 3$ p.c. from 1936 to 1939 have shown a $62\cdot 1$ p.c. increase for the first three years of war.
