The degree of concentration of manufacturing production in large units is illustrated in Table 2. In the Province of Quebec 50.1 p.c. of all persons engaged in manufacturing were employed in establishments having 500 or more employees, as compared with 45.9 p.c. for Canada as a whole. Ordinarily, Ontario ranks second in the concentration of manufacturing production. In 1942, however, British Columbia with 47.2 p.c. came second, this being due to the large shipbuilding plants located there. Ontario ranked third with a percentage of 46.7, followed by Nova Scotia with 35.7, Manitoba 32.9, New Brunswick 29.5, and Alberta 14.4.
