The degree of concentration of manufacturing production in large units is illustrated in Table 2. In the Province of Quebec $50\cdot 1$ p.c. of all persons engaged in manufacturing were employed in establishments having 500 or more employees, as compared with $45\cdot 9$ p.c. for Canada as a whole. Ordinarily, Ontario ranks second in the concentration of manufacturing production. In 1942, however, British Columbia with $47\cdot 2$ p.c. came second, this being due to the large shipbuilding plants located there. Ontario ranked third with a percentage of $46\cdot 7$, followed by Nova . Scotia with $35\cdot 7$, Manitoba $32\cdot 9$, New Brunswick $29\cdot 5$, and Alberta $14\cdot 4$.
