that of 0.6 p.c. in the Dominion as a whole. As may be seen from Table 3, however, activity in most of these centres slackened in the latter months of 1944. On the average, the index numbers of employment in Montreal, Toronto and Winnipeg reached new peaks in 1944, while those in Quebec, Ottawa, Hamilton, Windsor and Vancouver were reduced.

The index numbers of payrolls in the eight cities as a whole averaged  $2 \cdot 6$  p.c. higher in the year under review than in 1943, the increase exceeding that of  $2 \cdot 3$  p.c. reported in the Dominion as a whole. However, in Hamilton, Windsor and Vancouver the reported disbursements in weekly salaries and wages were lower than in the preceding 12 months. In all eight cities the general average earnings per person in recorded employment reached new high levels during 1944.
