The marked increase in the past 20 years in non-indictable convictions has been due, almost entirely, to breaches of traffic regulations, which have risen from 60,063 in 1924 to 274,573 during 1943 or from 42 p.c. of the total in 1924 to 59·0 p.c in 1943. Breaches of the radio licence laws have increased rapidly during the past two years, due, perhaps, to stricter enforcement. The decline in convictions for non-indictable offences from 1942 to 1943 was due to a decrease in convictions for breaches of traffic laws; the first since 1936.

Convictions for Drunkenness.—The number of convictions for drunkenness which has shown a fairly steady increase since 1933, decreased by 5.6 p.c. in 1943 as compared with 1942.
