The degree of concentration of manufacturing production in large units is illustrated in Table 2. In the Province of Quebec,  $51\cdot3$  p.c. of all persons engaged in manufacturing were employed in establishments having 500 or more employees, as compared with  $46\cdot9$  p.c. for Canada as a whole.
