

all over 1,000 square miles in area: Great Bear (12,000), Great Slave (11,170), Winnipeg (9,398), Athabaska (3,058), Reindeer (2,444), Winnipegosis (2,086), Nipigon (1,870), Manitoba (1,817), Dubawnt (1,600), Lake of the Woods (1,346), Lake Melville (1,132) and Southern Indian (1,060). Apart from these, named as notable for their size, there are innumerable other lakes scattered all over that major portion of the area of Canada lying within the Canadian Shield. In an area of 6,094 square miles, accurately mapped, just south and east of Lake Winnipeg, there are 3,000 lakes; in an area of 5,294 square miles, accurately mapped, south-west of Reindeer Lake in Saskatchewan, there are 7,500 lakes.
