For the year 1948, Ontario, which had 43 p.c. of the registrations of motorvehicles in Canada, had 54 p.c. of the total convictions for breaches of traffic regulations; Quebec in the same year had 17 p.c. of the motor-vehicles and 27 p.c. of the convictions. In interpreting the figures in this way, however, it should be pointed out that traffic regulations are by no means uniform throughout Canada and no account is taken of the differences in the degrees of urbanization in the provinces. Thus, the above two provinces have large urban centres, while in provinces with lower degrees of urbanization such as the Maritimes, Saskatchewan and Alberta, convictions are low in proportion to the number of motor-vehicles registered.

Convictions for Drunkenness and Offences against the Liquor Acts.— The 1947 and 1948 figures for such convictions are somewhat out of line with those for previous years, due to a change in method of compilation. The compilation, previously done by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was turned over in 1947 to the local court officials and now consists of the total number of convictions for each offence tabulated by the disposition of the case. Offences recorded against the Liquor Control Act include such infractions as the unlawful possession or the unlawful sale of liquor but exclude cases of drunkenness, a distinction that can be made more accurately by the local court officials.
