Juvenile Deliquencies.—The St. John's Juvenile Court was established on Jan. 23, 1945, under the provisions of the Welfare of Children Act (No. 57 of 1944), and the territorial limits of the jurisdiction of the Judge of the Juvenile Court were defined as the Electoral Districts of St. John's East and West. Cases of juvenile delinquency occurring outside of these limits are dealt with by the magistrate who has powers similar to those of the Judge of the Juvenile Court for disposing of these cases under the provisions of the Welfare of Children Act.

During the year ended Mar. 31, 1949, 147 children appeared in court. Five cases were adjourned sine die, 16 were dismissed and 126 found delinquent.
