Subsection 2.—The Manufactures of Ouebec

Quebec contributes about 30 p.c. of the total value of manufactured products of Canada. Quebec's forests, water power, minerals, and agricultural lands, and also its geographic position astride the St. Lawrence estuary permitting sea-going vessels to reach its main centres of population, are among the assets that have tended to develop manufacturing industries. In addition, Quebec has a stable and industrious population, which is an important factor in industries such as textiles, clothing, leather boots and shoes, etc., where a large labour force is required. The production of pulp and paper occupies the premier position, accounting for about 11 p.c. of the gross value of Quebec manufactures and about 49 p.c. of the Canadian total for this industry. Other industries in which Quebec predominates are: tobacco, cigars and cigarettes with 91 p.c. of the Canadian total; cotton varn and cloth 70 p.c.; synthetic textiles and silk 67 p.c.; women's factory clothing 67 p.c.; leather boots and shoes 62 p.c.; men's factory clothing 59 p.c.; fur goods 49 p.c.; railway rolling-stock 48 p.c.; and hosiery and knitted goods 42 p.c. Quebec is an outstanding manufacturing province by reason of her large individual industries and not so much on account of a great diversification of manufacturing activity.
