such matters as the times of coming into effect or expiration of Acts, ordinances, contracts and agreements, times of opening and closing registration offices, law courts, post offices and other public offices, times of open or close seasons for game, and times of opening and closing business houses and places of amusement.

PART IV.—ASTROPHYSICS

The science of astrophysics is carried on by three Canadian institutions: the Dominion Observatory, Ottawa, Ont., the Dominion Astrophysical Observatory, Victoria, B.C. (operated by the Department of Mines and Technical Surveys), and the David Dunlap Observatory, associated with the University of Toronto. Of the two Government institutions, the Dominion Observatory at Ottawa has specialized mainly in the astronomy of position in solar physics and in various branches of geophysical work, while the major effort in astrophysics has been concentrated at the Dominion Astrophysical Observatory at Victoria, B.C. The David Dunlap Observatory is a newer institution founded in 1935 with very fine astrophysical equipment of a kind similar to that in use at Victoria. It not only performs the function of a privately financed and administrated research institution but is also the nucleus of a university department of astronomy.
