Canadian Births.—In Canada, the birth rate in 1921 was 29 per 1,000 Since a rate of 35 per 1,000 is very high for countries of modern western civilization the Canadian birth rate had probably not fallen far or for long before then. fell continuously until 1937 when it was 20 per 1,000 but then, owing to economic recovery and the War, it rose to 22 in 1940, to 24 in 1943 and reached its highest point in 1947 at 28.7. As was the case in most other countries, there was a slight decline in 1948 and the Canadian rate has remained remarkably steady at just over 27 for the four years 1948-51. The birth rates in the provinces followed the same general trend, but in the Maritimes the fall stopped before 1930.
