The increase or decrease for each classification in 1953 as compared with 1952 is given in Table 2.

Table 3 shows that in 1953, $55 \cdot 5$ p.c. of the persons convicted of indictable offences had not gone beyond elementary school grades in education, $40 \cdot 0$ p.c. were 24 years of age or younger, $11 \cdot 5$ p.c. were 45 years of age or over, and $72 \cdot 2$ p.c. lived in urban centres. Of these offenders 94.0 p.c. were males, 89.4 p.c. were born in Canada, 54.9 p.c. were unmarried, $25 \cdot 9$ p.c. were recorded as labourers and $6 \cdot 3$ p.c. had no remunerative employment. These percentages have changed very little in recent years.
