In 1953, 28 of the 73 men found guilty of manslaughter and 19 of the 43 convicted of rape were under 25 years of age; $62 \cdot 9$ p.c. of the men found guilty of burglary and robbery were in that group as well as $46 \cdot 8$ p.c. of those convicted of offences against property without violence, which includes all thefts, $79 \cdot 7$ p.c. of those responsible for stolen automobiles, $50 \cdot 6$ p.c. of those who maliciously damaged property, $41 \cdot 1$ p.c. of those found carrying offensive weapons and $47 \cdot 2$ p.c. of the prison escapers.

There were 1,766 women offenders in 1953, 641 of them under 25 years of age; nearly half (311) of the young offenders were guilty of receiving stolen goods. Of the 96 women convicted under the Opium and Narcotic Drug Act, 33 were in the young group as were 29 of the 60 found guilty of forgery and uttering; 3 of the 15 female prison escapers were also young women.
